

## First shipment of Zeehan low grade furnace slag/matte leaves Burnie Port

25<sup>th</sup> September 2020

Dear fellow Tartana Shareholder,

Tartana Resources is pleased to announce that the first 22,000 tonne shipment of Zeehan low grade furnace slag/matte has left the Burnie Port on route to South Korea. This follows the signing of an agreement with MCC Non Ferrous Trading LLC for the export sales of Zeehan low grade zinc matte/slag in a contract valued at around US\$20 million as announced on the 18<sup>th</sup> August 2020.

The agreement calls for regular 10,000 to 30,000 tonne shipments per month through the Port of Burnie. Tartana has existing permits for the export of 43,000 tonnes with further export tonnage subject to West Coast Council and Tasmanian Department of the Environment approval. The Company will be providing submissions to these entities as soon as practical.

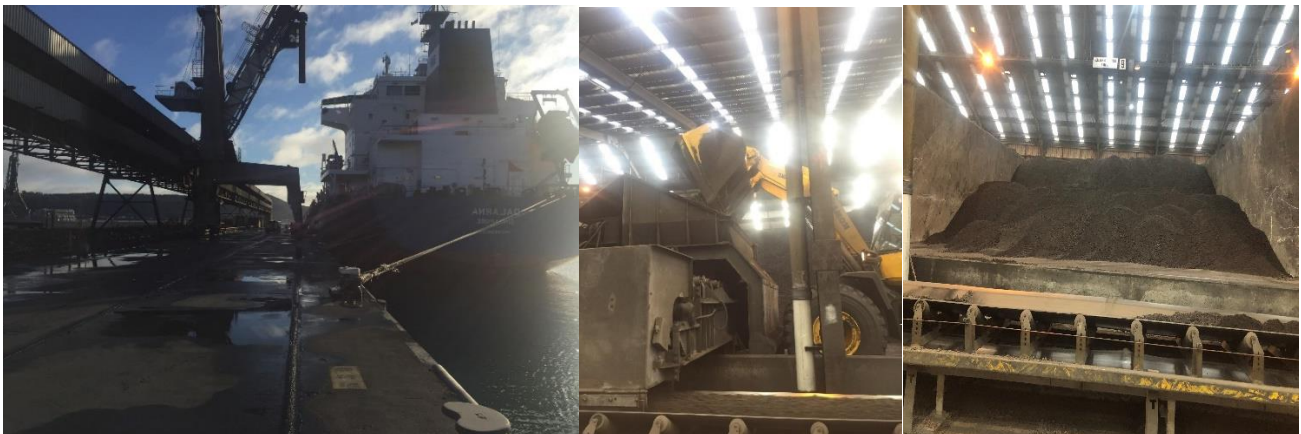


Figure 1. M/V Dalarna V.2001 being loaded at Burnie Port on 23/09/2020

Elsewhere, Tartana has received the results from the bottle roll tests to determine copper recovery and acid consumption from the existing heaps at the Tartana mine site, near Chillagoe, north Queensland. Encouragingly, recovered copper ranges from 0.8 to 1.2 kg/tonne at a 10 kg/t acid concentration which is in line with expectations. Next steps involve finalising the refurbishment and restart costs, identifying key personnel and securing finance. Overall restart costs are expected to be around \$0.5m.
